

Fishing Camp

Camp Overview

Day One involves assessment of the students' current fishing ability, an overall introduction and assignment to a particular group and instructor based on ability.

Students are assigned to an instructor depending on ability and receive relevant instruction necessary to their level throughout the week.

Over the course of the camp students partake in both river and lake fishing for both wild brown trout and pike at various locations along the Kells Blackwater in County Meath.

Students learn how to read the river, familiarize themselves with flies and various casting techniques.
